## Big Change from Small Change



**We directly support the education of disadvantaged women in Sudan and South Sudan.**

Women's Education Partnership pays for:-

- The tuition fees of over 100 women scholars at University in Khartoum, Sudan and in Juba, South Sudan. We find and support the most able women from the poorest areas.
- Literacy programmes for over 500 women and we train 20 women teachers working with orphans.
- Eye care and health care for women where there is greatest need.
- The training of basic health care nurses from the local community.



For over 15 years we have been listening to the poorest women in Sudan and now in South Sudan also. The women want opportunities which will help them improve the quality of family life, community life and the life of their nation. The women have told us they need **education and health care** to help them make progress.



**We do what the women tell us to do.**

Our overheads are very low. We have only 4 paid administrative staff and they are local women and men working in Khartoum.

# Big Change from Small Change



Women's Education Partnership paid the university fees for three years for Hazrun.

She graduated in April with a BA

(distinction) in Health Sciences. She is a Nuba, from Kadugli.

"I am the only one in my large family to go to university because there is not enough income for our family.

When peace comes, I will go back to the Nuba Mountains to help the people who are needy."



Nusebia comes from a very poor family and we supported her at university.

"From university I learnt values such as kindness and respect

and developed my skills in English language and computers. I also got more information about healthy food and nutrition and I learned to be patient with sick people. All this will enable me to take up my role in society. I am working now in a physical therapy centre in Khartoum."

**£30** funds a teacher of basic literacy in Sudan to teach one class of over 40 women for a month.

**£120 (or £10 a month)** funds a monthly eye care clinic for up to 50 disadvantaged women in the settlements around Khartoum.

**£480 (or £40 a month)** supports a (non-residential) scholarship for a year at Juba University, South Sudan to study science subjects.

**£600 (or £50 a month)** supports a (non-residential) student for a year at Ahfad University for Women, Omdurman, Sudan.

**£2700 (or £75 a month over 3 years)** trains 2 women medical assistants, chosen from their local community, to work in a health clinic which we support in Juba, South Sudan.

**£1,200 (or £100 a month)** gives 10 orphan children a year's education in a self help elementary school in Khartoum's internally displaced areas. It also gives direct support to the schools in a simple win-win arrangement for struggling communities.

**£3000 (or £125 a month over 2 years)** pays the fees of 3 women university students for their 3 year undergraduate course in Sudan. We monitor their progress regularly and the Director meets all our students twice a year.

**£7,500** supports an HIV/Aids awareness outreach for a year to 2,500 people in vulnerable groups living in the internal refugee areas around Khartoum, Sudan.
